

Clarence Bozeman

Clarence Bozeman served as the driver for the family of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. from 1958 – 60, where he transported Dr. King and his wife Coretta on speaking engagements throughout Alabama. During those occasions he had the opportunity to share in the private thoughts and conversations with Dr. and Mrs. King, from aspirations and barriers



in the black community, the Montgomery bus boycott, student sit-ins and other civil rights challenges.

Throughout the years, Bozeman has taught high school in both Alabama and Ohio, participated in civil rights demonstrations in Alabama and lectured at churches, colleges and universities on the history of the civil rights movement, and the trials, tribulations and legacy of Dr. King. Bozeman retired from public education as principal of Shaw High School in East Cleveland.

Bozeman graduated from Alabama State University, where he earned his Bachelor of Arts in American History and Social Studies. He received his master's in Education Administration from Fordham University an educational specialist degree from Cleveland State University and was a NEH Fellow at the University of California at Berkeley. He was recently awarded an honorary doctorate from Wilberforce University.

Reverend Gloria Chaney

Reverend Gloria Chaney is the Pastor at Church of the Master in Cleveland Heights, an instructor and a never-ending scholar in church and religious history.

Rev. Chaney is an active participant at the Hampton Ministers Council and Chaplain for the Cuyahoga Section of the National



Council of Negro Women, Inc. In 2011, she was appointed the first female Chaplain for the Cleveland Police Department. In 2017, she was appointed Chaplain for the FBI Department of Justice. She also serves as a member of the esteemed Bluecoats, Inc.

Her educational propensity is demonstrated with an Associate of Arts degree from Cuyahoga Community College, a Bachelor of Arts degree in Religious Studies as well as a Master of Arts in Theological Educational Administration, both obtained from Ursuline College.
