A grade of C or higher is required in English Composition courses and all Health Science major requirements.

This map represents one example of how to complete the AAS and BSHS degrees. Students should work closely with counselors/advisors at both institutions to discuss options.

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CSU requires a minimum of 120 total credit hours for graduation. At least 30 credits must be completed in-residence at CSU. At least 24 of the in-residence credits must be completed at the upper division (300/400) level. Students deficient in total credits or in-residence must take additional elective credits to meet the minimum requirements. Depending upon other elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above or may need additional electives.
